**Re: Enbridge Pipelines (Athabasca) Inc. ("Enbridge Athabasca")

On March 6, 2006 Enbridge Athabasca applied to Alberta Energy and Utilities Board (the "Board" or the "EUB"), as amended on May 12, 2006, for a licence to construct and operate crude oil and diluent pipelines, in the Bruderheim, Alberta area (the "Stonefell Pipelines"). Specifically, the Stonefell Pipelines are comprised of:

- a NPS 24 pipeline lateral to transport blended crude oil from an interconnection with the Inter Pipeline Fund ("IPF") pipeline system to Enbridge Athabasca's Stonefell Terminal;
- a NPS 12 pipeline lateral to transport diluent from the Stonefell Terminal to the interconnection with the IPF pipeline system; and,
- a NPS 24 pipeline to transport upgraded crude oil from the Stonefell Terminal to the Edmonton Terminal (the "products pipeline").

Through correspondence with the Board, most recently on December 4, 2006, Enbridge Athabasca advised that it was continuing to work towards resolving objections to the Stonefell Pipelines and Waupisoo Pipeline (EUB Application No. 1460029) applications. Enbridge Athabasca is pleased to advise that there are no longer any objections to the Stonefell Pipelines application.

Enbridge Athabasca is also pleased to advise that it has been successful in finalizing commercial arrangements that would allow volumes originally planned to be shipped on the products pipeline to instead be transported on the Waupisoo Pipeline. As a result, Enbridge Athabasca hereby withdraws the products pipeline from the Stonefell Pipelines application. The pipeline laterals contained in the application are not affected by this change.

It is important to note that there would be reduced impact along the proposed pipeline route as a result of the withdrawal of the products line. In this connection, Enbridge Athabasca will be notifying landowners and aboriginal groups of this change by separate

letter shortly. At the same time, Enbridge Athabasca stresses that it will honour all commitments made to landowners during discussions to secure land for the products line, including payment of the compensation that has been committed to landowners.

For your reference, please find attached the following revisions to the application due to the withdrawal of the products line:

- i) a revised Schedule 1 reflecting an updated total number of base maps and changing the company contact to Bill Bingham;
- ii) a revised Schedule 3 (Crude Oil) to exclude the need for Ministerial Consent from Alberta Infrastructure as the IPF laterals are not within the Edmonton TUC, to indicate that there are no outstanding objections, and to indicate that public consultation and notification requirements have been met;
- iii) a revised Schedule 3 (Diluent) to indicate that there are no outstanding objections, and to indicate that public consultation and notification requirements have been met;
- iv) a revised Schedule 3.1 (Crude Oil) to delete line no. 002;
- v) a revised PFD to delete the products pipeline;
- vi) two revised base maps for TWP 056-21W4 and SW. 056-21W4.
