


Crude oil is refined into products we all use every day.

Enbridge has been transporting North American crude oil to U.S. refineries through underground pipelines for decades — safely and reliably. The safe operation and maintenance of our pipelines is Enbridge's top priority.

Line 3 was originally put into service in 1968. Due to increasing repairs and disruptions to landowners and the environment, Enbridge looked to replacing the line with a privately funded investment of \$69 million in the state of North Dakota for the 12-mile segment. That replacement work started in August and is completing in October of 2020 with the support of all impacted landowners and local leaders.

In addition to safety as a maintenance project, this project has provided economic benefits in terms of construction jobs, purchase of local services and supplies, and through increased tax contributions.
