



Stockbridge Terminal

Enbridge crude oil tank facilities temporarily store crude oil as it moves through our pipeline system to be delivered to refineries serving customers. Crude oil tank facilities—also called terminals—are an integral part of our interstate transportation system and serve important operational functions.

The Stockbridge Terminal is located in eastern Michigan, in Ingham County. Enbridge purchased the Stockbridge facility in 1999, which included one crude oil tank built in 1974, and is positioned along the Enbridge pipeline route. That year, Enbridge added Line 17 pipeline to our system and built a second tank at the Stockbridge facility. Enbridge added a third tank in 2004.

Nearly ten years later, Enbridge expanded with a new outbound pipeline, Line 79, and beginning in 2013 Enbridge built a new pump station, fire pond and hydrant system, as well as an additional storage tank. This terminal continues to grow into a vital hub for Enbridge liquids operations in the U.S., as part of a crude oil pipeline delivery system transporting North American liquid petroleum to U.S. and Canadian refineries to meet North America's energy needs.

The workforce at the Stockbridge Terminal has grown over 13 years, from two to 15 full-time Enbridge employees.

Safe and reliable operations are at the foundation of Enbridge's business at the Stockbridge Terminal. Built-in safety features include the use of multiple onsite systems in place to promptly initiate remote shutdown and isolation, routine inspection and maintenance, cathodic protection and electrical grounding systems, primary and secondary containment measures, including dikes that can hold 110% or more of the petroleum stored in the tank,

Over the past decade, Enbridge liquids pipelines have delivered more than 39 billion barrels of crude oil and other petroleum or natural gas liquids, with a safe delivery record of 99.99996%.

Annually, we engage local emergency responders and provide support with training, equipment and donations.

All Enbridge pipelines and facilities are monitored 24 hours a day, in addition to routine aerial right-of-way patrols. As the operators of vital energy infrastructure across North America, we know that the public has entrusted us with the responsibility to deliver the energy we all need, safely and reliably.
