Enbridge exists to help fuel quality of life for millions of people across North America.

The safety of the communities near our projects and operations, and the people who live and work along our system, remain our highest priority.

The Enbridge Safe Community First Responder program considers grants to emergency response organizations that support communities within 10 miles (in the U.S.) or 20 kilometers (in Canada) of our operations.

Who's eligible for Safe Community grants?

Grants for safety equipment, professional training or educational program delivery are available to organizations such as:

- Fire departments
- Emergency medical and rescue services
- Emergency management organizations
- 9-1-1 centers
- Ambulance services
- Law enforcement organizations



How can these grants be used?

Requests will be considered for funding toward safety equipment such as rescue sleds, firefighting apparatus and/or tools, communications and training technologies, personal protective equipment (PPE), boats, ATVs, vehicles, flashlights, automated external defibrillators (AEDs), or HAZMAT or related training.

Ineligible requests include those pertaining to: facility operating costs; firearms and supplies; bulletproof vests; Tasers; road signs; K-9s; body cameras; recording devices; and crowd control equipment.

How do we apply?

The application for the Safe Community First Responder program is available at enbridge.com/funding.

Funding decisions for Safe Community First Responder grants take 8 to 12 weeks at minimum.
