Enbridge Inc. (the “**Corporation**”) is hereby qualifying the distribution (the “**Offering**”) of 20,000,000 cumulative redeemable minimum rate reset preference shares, Series 19 (“**Series 19 Shares**”) of the Corporation at a price of \$25.00 per Series 19 Share being offered to the public through the Underwriters (as defined herein). See “Details of the Offering” and “Plan of Distribution”.

The holders of Series 19 Shares will be entitled to receive, as and when declared by the board of directors of the Corporation (the “**Board**”) out of moneys of the Corporation properly applicable to the payment of dividends, fixed, cumulative, preferential cash dividends for the initial period from and including the date of issue of the Series 19 Shares to but excluding March 1, 2023 (the “**Initial Fixed Rate Period**”), at an annual rate of \$1.225 per Series 19 Share, payable quarterly on the first day of March, June, September and December in each year (less any tax required to be deducted and withheld by the Corporation). If any such date is not a business day, the dividend will be paid on the next succeeding business day. Assuming an issue date of December 11, 2017, the first dividend, if declared, will be payable March 1, 2018 in the amount of \$0.2685 per Series 19 Share.

For every five-year period after the Initial Fixed Rate Period (each a “**Subsequent Fixed Rate Period**”, as defined herein), the holders of Series 19 Shares shall be entitled to receive, as and when declared by the Board, fixed, cumulative, preferential cash dividends, payable quarterly on the first day of March, June, September and December in each year, in the amount per share equal to the Annual Fixed Dividend Rate (as defined herein) for such Subsequent Fixed Rate Period. The Annual Fixed Dividend Rate for the ensuing Subsequent Fixed Rate Period will be determined by the Corporation on the Fixed Rate Calculation Date (as defined herein) and will be equal to the sum of the Government of Canada Yield (as defined herein) on the Fixed Rate Calculation Date plus a spread of 3.17%, provided that, in any event, such rate shall not be less than 4.90%. This spread will remain unchanged over the life of the Series 19 Shares. See “Details of the Offering”.

The Series 19 Shares shall not be redeemable prior to March 1, 2023. On March 1, 2023, and on March 1 in every fifth year thereafter, the Corporation may, at its option, upon not less than 30 days and not more than 60 days prior written notice, redeem for cash all or any part of the outstanding Series 19 Shares by the payment of \$25.00 per Series 19 Share plus all accrued and unpaid dividends (less any tax required to be deducted and withheld by the Corporation). See “Details of the Offering”.

Option to Convert into Series 20 Shares

The holders of the Series 19 Shares will have the right to convert all or any of their Series 19 Shares into cumulative redeemable preference shares, Series 20 of the Corporation (the “**Series 20 Shares**”), subject to certain conditions as described herein, on March 1, 2023 and on March 1 in every fifth year thereafter. The holders of the Series 20 Shares will be entitled to receive, as and when declared by the Board, quarterly floating rate cumulative preferential cash dividends payable on the first day of March, June, September and December in each year (each such quarterly dividend period is referred to as a “**Quarterly Floating Rate Period**”, as defined herein) in the amount per share determined by multiplying the Floating Quarterly Dividend Rate (as defined herein) for such Quarterly Floating Rate Period by \$25.00 and multiplying that product by a fraction, the numerator of which is the actual number of days in such Quarterly Floating Rate Period and the denominator of which is 365 or 366, depending upon the actual number of days in the applicable year (less any tax required to be deducted and withheld by the Corporation). If any such date is not a business day, the dividend will be paid on the next succeeding business day. The Floating Quarterly Dividend Rate will be the annual rate of interest equal to the sum of the T-Bill Rate (as defined herein) on the applicable Floating Rate Calculation Date (as defined herein) plus a spread of 3.17%. See “Details of the Offering”.

The Series 19 Shares and Series 20 Shares are series of shares in the same class. The conversion right entitles holders to elect periodically which of the two series they wish to hold and does not entitle holders to receive a different class or type of securities. Other than the different dividend rights and redemption rights attached thereto, the Series 19 Shares and Series 20 Shares are identical in all material respects.

- (1) The Underwriters’ fee for the Series 19 Shares is \$0.25 for each share sold to certain institutions by closing of the Offering, and \$0.75 per share for all other Series 19 Shares purchased by the Underwriters (as defined herein). The Underwriters’ fee indicated in the table assumes that no Series 19 Shares are sold to such institutions.
- (2) Before deducting the estimated expenses of the Offering of approximately \$300,000. The expenses of the Offering will be paid from the general funds of the Corporation.

There is no market through which the Series 19 Shares may be sold and purchasers may not be able to resell Series 19 Shares purchased under this Prospectus Supplement. This may affect the pricing of the Series 19 Shares in the secondary market, the transparency and availability of trading prices, the liquidity of the Series 19 Shares and the extent of issuer regulation. The Toronto Stock Exchange (the “**TSX**”) has conditionally approved the listing of the Series 19 Shares and Series 20 Shares described in this Prospectus Supplement. Listing is subject to the Corporation fulfilling all the listing requirements of the TSX. There can be no assurance that the Series 19 Shares and Series 20 Shares will be accepted for listing on the TSX.

It is currently anticipated that the closing date of the Offering (the “**Offering Closing Date**”) will be on or about December 11, 2017, or such later date as the Corporation and the Underwriters may agree but in any event not later than December 29, 2017. See “Details of the Offering”.

The terms of the Offering were determined by negotiations between the Corporation and Scotia Capital Inc., BMO Nesbitt Burns Inc., CIBC World Markets Inc., National Bank Financial Inc., RBC Dominion Securities Inc., TD Securities Inc., Desjardins Securities Inc. and HSBC Securities (Canada) Inc. (collectively, the “**Underwriters**”).

The Underwriters, as principals, conditionally offer the Series 19 Shares, subject to prior sale, if, as and when issued by the Corporation to, and accepted by, the Underwriters in accordance with the conditions contained in the Underwriting Agreement referred to under “Plan of Distribution”, and subject to the approval of certain legal matters relating to the Offering on behalf of the Corporation by McCarthy Tétrault LLP and on behalf of the Underwriters by Dentons Canada LLP.

Subscriptions for Series 19 Shares will be received subject to rejection or allotment in whole or in part and the Underwriters reserve the right to close the subscription books at any time without notice. Book-entry only certificates (in physical or electronic form) representing the Series 19 Shares will be issued in registered form to CDS Clearing and Depository Services Inc. (“**CDS**”) or its nominee and will be deposited with CDS on the Offering Closing Date. A purchaser

of Series 19 Shares will receive only a customer confirmation from a registered dealer which is a CDS participant and from or through which the Series 19 Shares are purchased. See “Depository Services”.

Subject to applicable laws, the Underwriters may, in connection with the Offering, over-allot or effect transactions which stabilize or maintain the market price of the Series 19 Shares at levels other than those which might otherwise prevail on the open market. **The Underwriters propose to offer the Series 19 Shares initially at the offering price specified above. After a reasonable effort has been made to sell all of the Series 19 Shares at the price specified, the Underwriters may reduce the selling price to investors from time to time in order to sell any of the Series 19 Shares remaining unsold. Any such reduction will not affect the proceeds received by the Corporation.** See “Plan of Distribution”.

In the opinion of counsel, the Series 19 Shares and the Series 20 Shares, if issued on the date hereof, generally would be qualified investments under the *Income Tax Act* (Canada) (the “**Tax Act**”) for certain tax-exempt trusts. See “Eligibility for Investment”.

Investing in the Series 19 Shares involves certain risks. See “Risk Factors” in the accompanying Prospectus and in this Prospectus Supplement.

Each of the Underwriters is, directly or indirectly, a subsidiary or an affiliate of a lender which is one of the lenders to the Corporation or its subsidiaries and to which the Corporation or its subsidiaries is currently indebted. Consequently, the Corporation may be considered a connected issuer of the Underwriters for the purposes of securities regulations in certain provinces of Canada. The net proceeds from this Offering may be used to reduce the Corporation’s indebtedness to such lenders. RECENT DEVELOPMENTS

On November 29, 2017, the Corporation announced the finalization of its strategic plan and outlook (the "**Plan**") following the Merger Transaction. The Plan includes the Corporation's intention to rationalize its asset mix to a pure regulated pipeline and utility business model and monetize certain non-core assets. In addition, the Board declared a quarterly dividend of \$0.671 per common share in the capital of the Corporation ("**Common Share**"), payable on March 1, 2018 to shareholders of record on February 15, 2018, representing a 10% increase from the prior quarterly rate of \$0.61 last declared on November 1, 2017 and paid on December 1, 2017. The Corporation also announced that it had entered into subscription agreements with three large institutional investors to issue 33,456,003 Common Shares from treasury, on a private placement basis, at a price of \$44.84 per Common Share, for gross proceeds of approximately \$1.5 billion (the "**Private Placement**"), subject to review and approval by the TSX. It is currently anticipated that the closing date of the Private Placement will be on or about December 6, 2017.

USE OF PROCEEDS

The net proceeds to the Corporation from the Offering will be approximately \$484,700,000, after deducting \$15,000,000 in underwriting commission and \$300,000 in estimated expenses of the Offering and assuming no Series 19 Shares are sold to certain institutions as described under "Plan of Distribution".

The net proceeds of the Offering will be used to partially fund capital projects, to reduce existing indebtedness and for other general corporate purposes of the Corporation and its affiliates. The Corporation may invest funds that it does not immediately require in short term marketable debt securities.

CHANGES IN CONSOLIDATED CAPITALIZATION

There have been no material changes in the share and loan capital of the Corporation on a consolidated basis from September 30, 2017 to the date of this Prospectus Supplement, other than the effect of changes in foreign currency exchange rates on United States dollar denominated loans, and:

- the issuance by the Corporation of US\$700,000,000 aggregate principal amount of unsecured floating rate notes pursuant to a prospectus supplement dated October 4, 2017;
- the issuance by the Corporation of \$650,000,000 aggregate principal amount of 5.375% fixed-to-floating rate subordinated notes, series 2017-B due 2077 pursuant to a prospectus supplement dated October 11, 2017;
- the issuance by Union Gas Limited of \$500,000,000 aggregate principal amount of unsecured medium term notes pursuant to first and second pricing supplements dated November 20, 2017, consisting of two equal tranches of 2.88% 10-year and 3.59% 30-year medium term notes, respectively;

- the issuance by Enbridge Gas Distribution Inc. of \$300,000,000 aggregate principal amount of 3.51% unsecured medium term notes pursuant to a second pricing supplement dated November 27, 2017; and
- the decrease in commercial paper, letters of credit and credit facility draws by approximately \$732 million which occurred subsequent to September 30, 2017.

After giving effect to the Offering, the shareholders' equity of the Corporation will increase by the amount of the net proceeds of the Offering and the issued and outstanding Series 19 Shares will increase by 20,000,000 shares. After giving effect to the Offering and the use of proceeds as discussed herein, assuming such funds are initially used to pay down short term indebtedness, the short term indebtedness of the Corporation will be reduced by approximately \$484,700,000 (assuming no institutional sales of Series 19 Shares).

DETAILS OF THE OFFERING

The following is a summary of the principal rights, privileges, restrictions and conditions attaching to the preference shares of the Corporation as a class and to be attached to the Series 19 Shares and Series 20 Shares. The Corporation will furnish on request a copy of the text of the provisions attaching to the preference shares as a class and the Series 19 Shares and Series 20 Shares, each as a series and such provisions will also be available on SEDAR at www.sedar.com.

Definition of Terms

The following definitions are relevant to the Series 19 Shares and the Series 20 Shares, as applicable.

“Annual Fixed Dividend Rate” means, for any Subsequent Fixed Rate Period, the annual rate of interest equal to the sum of the Government of Canada Yield on the applicable Fixed Rate Calculation Date and 3.17%, provided that, in any event, such rate shall not be less than 4.90%.

“Dividend Payment Date” means the first day of March, June, September and December in each year, or if such date is not a business day, the next succeeding business day.

“Fixed Rate Calculation Date” means, for any Subsequent Fixed Rate Period, the 30th day prior to the first day of such Subsequent Fixed Rate Period.

“Floating Quarterly Dividend Rate” means, for any Quarterly Floating Rate Period, the annual rate of interest equal to the sum of the T-Bill Rate on the applicable Floating Rate Calculation Date and 3.17%.

“Floating Rate Calculation Date” means, for any Quarterly Floating Rate Period, the 30th day prior to the first day of such Quarterly Floating Rate Period.

“Government of Canada Yield” on any date means the yield to maturity on such date (assuming semi-annual compounding) of a Canadian dollar denominated non-callable Government of Canada bond with a term to maturity of five years as quoted as of 10:00 a.m. (Toronto time) on such date and that appears on the Bloomberg Screen GCAN5YR <Index> Page on such date; provided that if such rate does not appear on the Bloomberg Screen GCAN5YR <Index> Page on such date, then the Government of Canada Yield shall mean the arithmetic average of the yields quoted to the Corporation by two registered Canadian investment dealers selected by the Corporation as being the annual yield to maturity on such date, compounded semi-annually, that a non-callable Government of Canada bond would carry if issued, in Canadian dollars, at 100% of its principal amount on such date with a term to maturity of five years.

“Initial Fixed Rate Period” means the period from and including the date of issue of the Series 19 Shares to but excluding March 1, 2023.

“Quarterly Commencement Date” means the first day of March, June, September and December in each year, commencing March 1, 2023.

“Quarterly Floating Rate Period” means the period from and including a Quarterly Commencement Date to but excluding the next succeeding Quarterly Commencement Date.

“Series 19 Conversion Date” means March 1, 2023, and March 1, in every fifth year thereafter.

“Series 20 Conversion Date” means March 1, 2028, and March 1, in every fifth year thereafter.

“Subsequent Fixed Rate Period” means, for the initial Subsequent Fixed Rate Period, the period from and including March 1, 2023 to but excluding March 1, 2028, and for each succeeding Subsequent Fixed Rate Period means the period from and including the day immediately following the last day of the immediately preceding Subsequent Fixed Rate Period to but excluding March 1, in the fifth year thereafter.

“T-Bill Rate” means, for any Quarterly Floating Rate Period, the average yield expressed as an annual rate on Government of Canada treasury bills, as reported by the Bank of Canada, for the most recent treasury bills auction preceding the applicable Floating Rate Calculation Date.

Certain Provisions of the Preference Shares as a Class

The Corporation is authorized to issue an unlimited number of preference shares without nominal or par value, issuable in series and, with respect to each series, the Board shall fix the number of shares comprising the series and determine the designation, rights, privileges, restrictions and conditions attaching to the shares of the series, subject to certain limitations.

The preference shares of each series shall rank on parity with the preference shares of every other series with respect to priority in the payment of dividends and with respect to priority on the return of capital or any other distribution of assets of the Corporation in the event of the liquidation, dissolution or winding-up of the Corporation, whether voluntary or involuntary (a “**liquidation distribution**”).

The preference shares of each series shall be entitled to preferences over the Common Shares and any other shares of the Corporation (together, the “**junior shares**”) that may rank junior to the preference shares with respect to priority in the payment of dividends and with respect to priority on a liquidation distribution. Subject to certain limitations, the Board may give the preference shares of any series such other preferences over the junior shares as the Board sees fit.

The holders of preference shares of a series shall not be entitled to receive notice of or to attend or vote at meetings of the shareholders of the Corporation except as required by law. At any meeting of the holders of the preference shares as a class or at any joint meeting of the holders of two or more series of the preference shares, each holder of preference shares entitled to vote thereat shall have on a poll one one-hundredth of a vote in respect of each dollar of the issue price of each share held, and the formalities to be observed with respect to the giving of notice of any such meeting, the quorum therefor and the conduct thereof shall mutatis mutandis be those then prescribed by the Corporation’s by-laws or standing Board resolutions with respect to meetings of shareholders.

Certain Provisions of the Series 19 Shares

Issue Price

The Series 19 Shares will have an issue price of \$25.00 per share.

Dividends on Series 19 Shares

During the Initial Fixed Rate Period, the holders of the Series 19 Shares shall be entitled to receive and the Corporation shall pay, as and when declared by the Board, out of the moneys of the Corporation properly applicable to the payment of dividends, fixed cumulative preferential cash dividends at an annual rate of \$1.225 per share, payable quarterly on each Dividend Payment Date in each year (less any tax required to be deducted and withheld by the Corporation). The first dividend, if declared, shall be payable on March 1, 2018, and, notwithstanding the foregoing, shall be in the amount of \$0.2685 per share, being the amount that is determined by multiplying \$1.225 by the number of days in the period from and including the anticipated date of issue of the Series 19 Shares of December 11, 2017, to but excluding March 1, 2018, and dividing that product by 365 (less any tax required to be deducted and withheld by the Corporation).

During each Subsequent Fixed Rate Period, the holders of the Series 19 Shares shall be entitled to receive and the Corporation shall pay, as and when declared by the Board, out of the moneys of the Corporation properly applicable to the payment of dividends, fixed cumulative preferential cash dividends, payable quarterly on each Dividend Payment Date, in the amount per share equal to the Annual Fixed Dividend Rate for such Subsequent Fixed Rate Period.

On each Fixed Rate Calculation Date, the Corporation shall determine the Annual Fixed Dividend Rate for the ensuing Subsequent Fixed Rate Period. The Corporation shall, on each Fixed Rate Calculation Date, give written notice of the Annual Fixed Dividend Rate for the ensuing Subsequent Fixed Rate Period to the registered holders of the then outstanding Series 19 Shares.

Redemption of Series 19 Shares

The Series 19 Shares shall not be redeemable prior to March 1, 2023. Subject to the provisions described under “Certain Provisions of the Series 19 Shares - Restrictions on Payments and Reductions of Capital”, on March 1, 2023 and on March 1 in every fifth year thereafter, the Corporation may, at its option, redeem all or any part of the Series 19 Shares by the payment of an amount in cash for each share to be redeemed equal to \$25.00 plus all accrued and unpaid dividends thereon to but excluding the date fixed for redemption (less any tax required to be deducted and withheld by the Corporation). Should any such date not be a business day, the redemption date will be the next succeeding business day.

Notice of any redemption of Series 19 Shares will be given by the Corporation not more than 60 days and not less than 30 days prior to the date fixed for redemption. If less than all of the outstanding Series 19 Shares are at any time to be redeemed, the shares so to be redeemed shall be selected by lot in such manner as the Board or the transfer agent, if any, appointed by the Corporation in respect of such shares shall decide, or, if the Board so decides, such shares may be redeemed pro rata (disregarding fractions).

If the Corporation gives notice to the holders of the Series 19 Shares of the redemption of all of the Series 19 Shares, the right of a holder of Series 19 Shares to convert such Series 19 Shares shall terminate and the Corporation shall not be required to give notice to the registered holders of the Series 19 Shares of an Annual Fixed Dividend Rate, a Floating Quarterly Dividend Rate or the conversion right of holders of Series 19 Shares.

Conversion of Series 19 Shares into Series 20 Shares

The Series 19 Shares shall not be convertible prior to March 1, 2023. Holders of Series 19 Shares shall have the right to elect to convert on each Series 19 Conversion Date, subject to restrictions on conversion described below, all or any of their Series 19 Shares into Series 20 Shares on the basis of one Series 20 Share for each Series 19 Share. Notice of a holder’s intention to convert Series 19 Shares must be received by the transfer agent and registrar for the Series 19 Shares at its principal office in Toronto or Calgary not earlier than the 30th day prior to, but not later than 5:00 p.m. (Toronto time) on the 15th day preceding, a Series 19 Conversion Date. Once received by the transfer agent and registrar on behalf of the Corporation, the election of a holder to convert is irrevocable.

The Corporation shall, not more than 60 days and not less than 30 days prior to the applicable Series 19 Conversion Date, give notice to the then registered holders of the Series 19 Shares of the conversion right. On the 30th day prior to each Series 19 Conversion Date, the Corporation shall give notice to the then registered holders of the Series 19 Shares of the Annual Fixed Dividend Rate for the Series 19 Shares for the next succeeding Subsequent Fixed Rate Period and the Floating Quarterly Dividend Rate for the Series 20 Shares for the next succeeding Quarterly Floating Rate Period.

Automatic Conversion

Holders of Series 19 Shares shall not be entitled to convert their shares into Series 20 Shares if the Corporation determines that there would remain outstanding on a Series 19 Conversion Date less than 1,000,000 Series 20 Shares, after having taken into account all Series 19 Shares tendered for conversion into Series 20 Shares and all Series 20 Shares tendered for conversion into Series 19 Shares. Furthermore, if the Corporation determines that there would remain outstanding on a Series 19 Conversion Date less than 1,000,000 Series 19 Shares, after having taken into account all Series 19 Shares tendered for conversion into Series 20 Shares and all Series 20 Shares tendered for conversion into Series 19 Shares, then all of the remaining outstanding Series 19 Shares shall be converted automatically into Series 20 Shares on the basis of one Series 20 Share for each Series 19 Share on the applicable Series 19 Conversion Date.

The Corporation reserves the right not to deliver Series 20 Shares to any person that the Corporation or its transfer agent has reason to believe is a person whose address is in, or that the Corporation or its transfer agent has reason to believe is a resident of, any jurisdiction outside Canada if such delivery would require the Corporation to take any action to comply with the securities laws of such jurisdiction.

The Series 19 Shares and Series 20 Shares are series of shares in the same class. The conversion right entitles holders to elect periodically which of the two series they wish to hold and does not entitle holders to receive a different class or type of securities. Other than the different dividend rights and redemption rights attached thereto, the Series 19 Shares and Series 20 Shares are identical in all material respects.

Purchase for Cancellation

Subject to the provisions described under “Certain Provisions of the Series 19 Shares - Restrictions on Payments and Reductions of Capital”, the Corporation may from time to time purchase for cancellation all or any part of the Series 19

Shares at any price by tender to all holders of Series 19 Shares or through the facilities of any stock exchange on which the Series 19 Shares are listed, or in any other manner, provided that in the case of a purchase in any other manner the price for such Series 19 Shares so purchased for cancellation shall not exceed the highest price offered for a board lot of Series 19 Shares on any stock exchange on which such shares are listed on the date of purchase for cancellation, plus costs of purchase.

Rights on Liquidation

In the event of the liquidation, dissolution or winding-up of the Corporation, whether voluntary or involuntary, or any other distribution of assets of the Corporation among its shareholders for the purpose of winding up its affairs, the holders of the Series 19 Shares shall be entitled to receive \$25.00 per Series 19 Share together with all accrued and unpaid dividends thereon (less any tax required to be deducted and withheld by the Corporation) before any amount shall be paid or any property or assets of the Corporation shall be distributed to the holders of the junior shares. After payment to the holders of the Series 19 Shares of the amount so payable to them, they shall not, as such, be entitled to share in any further distribution of the property or assets of the Corporation.

Restrictions on Payments and Reductions of Capital

So long as any Series 19 Shares are outstanding, the Corporation shall not:

- (a) call for redemption, purchase, reduce stated capital maintained by the Corporation or otherwise pay off less than all of the Series 19 Shares and all other preference shares of the Corporation then outstanding ranking prior to or on parity with the Series 19 Shares with respect to payment of dividends;
- (b) declare, pay or set apart for payment any dividends (other than stock dividends in shares of the Corporation ranking junior to the Series 19 Shares) on the Common Shares or any other shares ranking junior to the Series 19 Shares with respect to payment of dividends; or
- (c) call for redemption of, purchase, reduce stated capital maintained by the Corporation or otherwise pay for any shares of the Corporation ranking junior to the Series 19 Shares with respect to repayment of capital or with respect to payment of dividends,

unless all dividends up to and including the dividends payable on the last preceding dividend payment dates on the Series 19 Shares and on all other preference shares then outstanding ranking prior to or on a parity with the Series 19 Shares with respect to payment of dividends shall have been declared and paid or set apart for payment at the date of any such action.

Voting Rights

The holders of Series 19 Shares shall not be entitled to receive notice of or to attend or vote at meetings of the shareholders of the Corporation, except as required by law. At any meeting of the holders of the preference shares as a class or at any joint meeting of the holders of two or more series of the preference shares, each holder of preference shares entitled to vote thereat shall have on a poll one one-hundredth of a vote in respect of each dollar of the issue price of each shareholder.

Tax Election

The Series 19 Shares will be “taxable preferred shares” as defined in the Tax Act for purposes of the tax under Part IV.1 of the Tax Act applicable to certain corporate holders of the Series 19 Shares. The terms of the Series 19 Shares require the Corporation to make the necessary election under Part VI.1 of the Tax Act so that such corporate holders will not be subject to the tax under Part IV.1 of the Tax Act on dividends received (or deemed to be received) on the Series 19 Shares. See “Certain Canadian Federal Income Tax Considerations — Dividends”.

Business Day

If any day on which any dividend on the Series 19 Shares is payable by the Corporation or on or by which any other action is required to be taken by the Corporation is not a business day, then such dividend shall be payable and such other action may be taken on or by the next succeeding day that is a business day. For the purposes hereof, “business day” shall mean a day on which banks are generally open for business in each of Calgary, Alberta and Toronto, Ontario.

Certain Provisions of the Series 20 Shares

Issue Price

The Series 20 Shares will be issuable only upon conversion of Series 19 Shares and will have an ascribed issue price of \$25.00 per share.

Dividends on Series 20 Shares

During each Quarterly Floating Rate Period, the holders of the Series 20 Shares shall be entitled to receive and the Corporation shall pay, as and when declared by the Board, out of the moneys of the Corporation properly applicable to the payment of dividends, cumulative preferential cash dividends, payable on each Dividend Payment Date, in the amount per share determined by multiplying the Floating Quarterly Dividend Rate for such Quarterly Floating Rate Period by \$25.00 and multiplying that product by a fraction, the numerator of which is the actual number of days in such Quarterly Floating Rate Period and the denominator of which is 365 or 366, depending upon the actual number of days in the applicable year (less any tax required to be deducted and withheld by the Corporation).

On each Floating Rate Calculation Date, the Corporation shall determine the Floating Quarterly Dividend Rate for the ensuing Quarterly Floating Rate Period. The Corporation shall, on each Floating Rate Calculation Date, give written notice of the Floating Quarterly Dividend Rate for the ensuing Quarterly Floating Rate Period to the registered holders of the then outstanding Series 20 Shares.

Redemption of Series 20 Shares

Subject to the provisions described under “Certain Provisions of the Series 20 Shares - Restrictions on Payments and Reductions of Capital”, the Corporation may redeem all or any part of the Series 20 Shares by the payment of an amount in cash for each share to be redeemed equal to: (i) \$25.00 in the case of redemptions on any Series 20 Conversion Date on or after March 1, 2028 (the “**Series 20 Redemption Amount**”); or (ii) the Series 20 Redemption Amount plus \$0.50 per share in the case of redemptions on any date after March 1, 2023 that is not a Series 20 Conversion Date, in each case plus all accrued and unpaid dividends thereon (less any tax required to be deducted and withheld by the Corporation) to but excluding the date fixed for redemption. Should any such date not be a business day, the redemption date will be the next succeeding business day.

Notice of any redemption of Series 20 Shares will be given by the Corporation not more than 60 days and not less than 30 days prior to the date fixed for redemption. If less than all of the outstanding Series 20 Shares are at any time to be redeemed, the shares so to be redeemed shall be selected by lot in such manner as the Board or the transfer agent, if any, appointed by the Corporation in respect of such shares shall decide, or, if the Board so decides, such shares may be redeemed pro rata (disregarding fractions).

If the Corporation gives notice to the holders of the Series 20 Shares of the redemption of all of the Series 20 Shares, the right of a holder of Series 20 Shares to convert such Series 20 Shares shall terminate and the Corporation shall not be required to give notice to the registered holders of the Series 20 Shares of an Annual Fixed Dividend Rate, a Floating Quarterly Dividend Rate or the conversion right of holders of Series 20 Shares.

Conversion of Series 20 Shares into Series 19 Shares

The Series 20 Shares shall not be convertible prior to March 1, 2028. Holders of Series 20 Shares shall have the right to convert on each Series 20 Conversion Date, subject to restrictions on conversion described below, all or any of their Series 20 Shares into Series 19 Shares on the basis of one Series 19 Share for each Series 20 Share. Notice of a holder’s intention to convert Series 20 Shares must be received by the transfer agent and registrar for the Series 20 Shares at its principal office in Toronto or Calgary not earlier than the 30th day prior to, but not later than 5:00 p.m. (Toronto time) on the 15th day preceding, a Series 20 Conversion Date. Once received by the transfer agent and registrar on behalf of the Corporation, the election of a holder to convert is irrevocable.

The Corporation shall, not more than 60 days and not less than 30 days prior to the applicable Series 20 Conversion Date, give notice to the then registered holders of the Series 20 Shares of the conversion right. On the 30th day prior to each Series 20 Conversion Date, the Corporation shall give notice to the then registered holders of the Series 20 Shares of the Annual Fixed Dividend Rate for the Series 19 Shares for the next succeeding Subsequent Fixed Rate Period and the Floating Quarterly Dividend Rate for the Series 20 Shares for the next succeeding Quarterly Floating Rate Period.

Automatic Conversion

Holders of Series 20 Shares shall not be entitled to convert their shares into Series 19 Shares if the Corporation determines that there would remain outstanding on a Series 20 Conversion Date less than 1,000,000 Series 19 Shares, after having taken into account all Series 19 Shares tendered for conversion into Series 20 Shares and all Series 20 Shares tendered for conversion into Series 19 Shares. Furthermore, if the Corporation determines that there would remain outstanding on a Series 20 Conversion Date less than 1,000,000 Series 20 Shares, after having taken into account all Series 19 Shares tendered for conversion into Series 20 Shares and all Series 20 Shares tendered for conversion into Series 19 Shares, then all of the remaining outstanding Series 20 Shares shall be converted automatically into Series 19 Shares on the basis of one Series 19 Share for each Series 20 Share on the applicable Series 20 Conversion Date.

The Corporation reserves the right not to deliver Series 19 Shares to any person that the Corporation or its transfer agent has reason to believe is a person whose address is in, or that the Corporation or its transfer agent has reason to believe is a resident of, any jurisdiction outside Canada if such delivery would require the Corporation to take any action to comply with the securities laws of such jurisdiction.

The Series 19 Shares and Series 20 Shares are series of shares in the same class. The conversion right entitles holders to elect periodically which of the two series they wish to hold and does not entitle holders to receive a different class or type of securities. Other than the different dividend rights and redemption rights attached thereto, the Series 19 Shares and Series 20 Shares are identical in all material respects.

Purchase for Cancellation

Subject to the provisions described under “Certain Provisions of the Series 20 Shares - Restrictions on Payments and Reductions of Capital”, the Corporation may from time to time purchase for cancellation all or any part of the Series 20 Shares at any price by tender to all holders of Series 20 Shares or through the facilities of any stock exchange on which the Series 20 Shares are listed, or in any other manner, provided that in the case of a purchase in any other manner the price for such Series 20 Shares so purchased for cancellation shall not exceed the highest price offered for a board lot of Series 20 Shares on any stock exchange on which such shares are listed on the date of purchase for cancellation, plus costs of purchase.

Rights on Liquidation

In the event of the liquidation, dissolution or winding-up of the Corporation, whether voluntary or involuntary, or any other distribution of assets of the Corporation among its shareholders for the purpose of winding up its affairs, the holders of the Series 20 Shares shall be entitled to receive \$25.00 per Series 20 Share together with all accrued and unpaid dividends thereon (less any tax required to be deducted and withheld by the Corporation) before any amount shall be paid or any property or assets of the Corporation shall be distributed to the holders of junior shares. After payment to the holders of the Series 20 Shares of the amount so payable to them, they shall not, as such, be entitled to share in any further distribution of the property, or assets of the Corporation.

Restrictions on Payments and Reductions of Capital

So long as any Series 20 Shares are outstanding, the Corporation shall not:

- (a) call for redemption of, purchase, reduce stated capital maintained by the Corporation or otherwise pay off less than all of the Series 20 Shares and all other preference shares of the Corporation then outstanding ranking prior to or on parity with the Series 20 Shares with respect to payment of dividends;
- (b) declare, pay or set apart for payment any dividends (other than stock dividends in shares of the Corporation ranking junior to the Series 20 Shares) on the Common Shares or any other shares ranking junior to the Series 20 Shares with respect to payment of dividends; or
- (c) call for redemption of, purchase, reduce stated capital maintained by the Corporation or otherwise pay for any shares of the Corporation ranking junior to the Series 20 Shares with respect to repayment of capital or with respect to payment of dividends,

unless all dividends up to and including the dividends payable on the last preceding dividend payment dates on the Series 20 Shares and on all other preference shares then outstanding ranking prior to or on a parity with the Series 20 Shares with respect to payment of dividends shall have been declared and paid or set apart for payment at the date of any such action.

Voting Rights

The holders of Series 20 Shares shall not be entitled to receive notice of or to attend or vote at meetings of the shareholders of the Corporation, except as required by law. At any meeting of the holders of the preference shares as a class or at any joint meeting of the holders of two or more series of the preference shares, each holder of preference shares entitled to vote thereat shall have on a poll one one-hundredth of a vote in respect of each dollar of the issue price of each share held.

Tax Election

The Series 20 Shares will be “taxable preferred shares” as defined in the Tax Act for purposes of the tax under Part IV.1 of the Tax Act applicable to certain corporate holders of the Series 20 Shares. The terms of the Series 20 Shares require the Corporation to make the necessary election under Part VI.1 of the Tax Act so that such corporate holders will not be subject to the tax under Part IV.1 of the Tax Act on dividends received (or deemed to be received) on the Series 20 Shares. See “Certain Canadian Federal Income Tax Considerations — Dividends”.

Business Day

If any day on which any dividend on the Series 20 Shares is payable by the Corporation or on or by which any other action is required to be taken by the Corporation is not a business day, then such dividend shall be payable and such other action may be taken on or by the next succeeding day that is a business day. For the purposes hereof, “business day” shall mean a day on which banks are generally open for business in each of Calgary, Alberta and Toronto, Ontario.

DEPOSITORY SERVICES

The Series 19 Shares and Series 20 Shares will be issued in “book-entry only” form and must be purchased or transferred through a participant in the CDS depository service (“**CDS Participant**”). The Corporation will cause a global certificate or certificates (in physical or electronic form) representing any newly issued Series 19 Shares or Series 20 Shares to be delivered to, and registered in the name of, CDS or its nominee. All rights of holders of Series 19 Shares or Series 20 Shares must be exercised through, and all payments or other property to which such holder of Series 19 Shares or Series 20 Shares, as the case may be, is entitled, will be made or delivered by, CDS or the CDS Participant through which the holder of Series 19 Shares or Series 20 Shares holds such shares. Each person who acquires Series 19 Shares or Series 20 Shares will receive only a customer confirmation of purchase from the registered dealer from or through which the Series 19 Shares or Series 20 Shares are acquired in accordance with the practices and procedures of that registered dealer. The practices of registered dealers may vary, but generally customer confirmations are issued promptly after execution of a customer order. CDS is responsible for establishing and maintaining book-entry accounts for its CDS Participants having interests in the Series 19 Shares or Series 20 Shares.

The ability of a beneficial owner of Series 19 Shares or Series 20 Shares to pledge such shares or otherwise take action with respect to such owner’s interest in such shares (other than through a CDS Participant) may be limited due to the lack of a physical certificate.

The Corporation has the option to terminate registration of the Series 19 Shares and Series 20 Shares through the book-entry only system, in which event certificates for Series 19 Shares and Series 20 Shares in fully registered form will be issued to the beneficial owners of such shares or their nominees.

Neither the Corporation nor the Underwriters will assume any liability for: (a) any aspect of the records relating to the beneficial ownership of the Series 19 Shares or Series 20 Shares held by CDS or the payments relating thereto; (b) maintaining, supervising or reviewing any records relating to the Series 19 Shares or Series 20 Shares; or (c) any advice or representation made by or with respect to CDS and those contained in this Prospectus Supplement and relating to the rules governing CDS or any action to be taken by CDS or at the direction of its CDS Participants. The rules governing CDS provide that it acts as the agent and depository for the CDS Participants. As a result, CDS Participants must look solely to CDS and persons, other than CDS Participants, having an interest in the Series 19 Shares or Series 20 Shares must look solely to CDS Participants for payments made by or on behalf of the Corporation to CDS in respect of the Series 19 Shares or Series 20 Shares.

If: (i) required by applicable law; (ii) the book-entry only system ceases to exist; (iii) CDS advises the Corporation that it is no longer willing or able to discharge properly its responsibilities as depository with respect to the Series 19 Shares or Series 20 Shares and the Corporation is unable to locate a qualified successor; or (iv) the Corporation, at its option, decides to terminate the book-entry only system, then certificates representing the Series 19 Shares and Series 20 Shares, as applicable, will be made available to shareholders.

EARNINGS COVERAGE RATIOS

The following earnings coverage ratios have been calculated on a consolidated basis for the respective 12 month periods ended December 31, 2016 and September 30, 2017 and are derived from audited financial information in the case of December 31, 2016 and unaudited financial information in the case of September 30, 2017, in each case prepared in accordance with U.S. GAAP.

A third earnings coverage ratio has been included that gives pro forma effect to the Merger Transaction on the same basis as in the Corporation's unaudited pro forma condensed consolidated statement of earnings for the year ended December 31, 2016 included in the BAR.

The following ratios give pro forma effect to the issuance by the Corporation from time to time of preference shares and debt securities since December 31, 2016 and September 30, 2017, in the case of the December 31, 2016 and September 30, 2017 earnings coverage ratios, respectively, including:

- the issuance by the Corporation of the Series 19 Shares pursuant to this Prospectus Supplement;
- the issuance by the Corporation of \$750,000,000 aggregate principal amount of unsecured floating rate notes pursuant to a first pricing supplement dated May 19, 2017, the issuance by the Corporation of \$450,000,000 aggregate principal amount of 3.19% unsecured medium term notes pursuant to a second pricing supplement dated June 6, 2017, the issuance by the Corporation of \$450,000,000 aggregate principal amount of 3.20% unsecured medium term notes pursuant to a third pricing supplement dated June 6, 2017, the issuance by the Corporation of \$300,000,000 aggregate principal amount of 4.57% unsecured medium term notes pursuant to a fourth pricing supplement dated June 6, 2017, the issuance by the Corporation of US\$500,000,000 aggregate principal amount of unsecured floating rate notes pursuant to a prospectus supplement dated June 12, 2017, the issuance by the Corporation of US\$1,400,000,000 aggregate principal amount of unsecured medium term notes pursuant to a prospectus supplement dated June 27, 2017, the issuance by the Corporation of US\$1,000,000,000 aggregate principal amount of 5.50% fixed-to-floating rate subordinated notes, series 2017-A due 2077 pursuant to a prospectus supplement dated July 10, 2017, the issuance by the Corporation of \$1,000,000,000 aggregate principal amount of 5.375% fixed-to-floating rate subordinated notes, series 2017-B due 2077 pursuant to a prospectus supplement dated September 21, 2017, the issuance by the Corporation of US\$700,000,000 aggregate principal amount of unsecured floating rate notes pursuant to a prospectus supplement dated October 4, 2017, and the issuance by the Corporation of \$650,000,000 aggregate principal amount of 5.375% fixed-to-floating rate subordinated notes, series 2017-B due 2077 pursuant to a prospectus supplement dated October 11, 2017;

(1) Earnings coverage on a net earnings basis is equal to earnings attributable to the Corporation plus net interest expense and income taxes divided by net interest expense plus capitalized interest and preference share dividend obligations.

The Corporation evaluates its performance using a variety of measures. Earnings coverage discussed above is not defined under U.S. GAAP and, therefore, should not be considered in isolation or as an alternative to, or more meaningful than, net earnings as determined in accordance with U.S. GAAP as an indicator of the Corporation’s financial performance or liquidity. This measure is not necessarily comparable to a similarly titled measure of another company.

The Corporation’s pro forma dividend requirements on all of its preference shares, adjusted for changes in dividend amounts on certain preference shares that took effect as a result of dividend rate adjustments in accordance with the terms of such preference shares and adjusted to a before tax equivalent using an effective income tax expense rate of 6% at December 31, 2016 and 16% at September 30, 2017, amounted to approximately \$339 million for the 12 months ended December 31, 2016 and approximately \$418 million for the 12 months ended September 30, 2017. The Corporation’s pro forma interest requirements for the 12 months ended December 31, 2016 amounted to approximately \$2,234 million and for the 12 months ended September 30, 2017 amounted to approximately \$2,637 million. The Corporation’s earnings before interest and income tax for the 12 months ended December 31, 2016 were approximately \$3,780 million, which is 1.5 times the Corporation’s aggregate pro forma dividend and interest requirements for this period. The Corporation’s earnings before interest and income tax for the 12 months ended September 30, 2017 were approximately \$5,979 million, which is 2.0 times the Corporation’s aggregate pro forma dividend and interest requirements for this period.

The Corporation’s pro forma dividend requirements on all of its preference shares adjusted to a before tax equivalent using a pro forma effective income tax expense rate of 11% at December 31, 2016 amounted to approximately \$358 million for the 12 months ended December 31, 2016. The Corporation’s interest requirements, including giving pro forma effect to the Merger Transaction, amounted to approximately \$3,024 million for the 12 months ended December 31, 2016. The Corporation’s earnings before interest and income taxes, including giving pro forma effect to the Merger Transaction, for the 12 months ended December 31, 2016 were approximately \$5,772 million, which is 1.7 times the Corporation’s aggregate pro forma dividend and interest requirements for this period.

CREDIT RATINGS

The Series 19 Shares have been assigned a rating of “P-2 (low)” by Standard & Poor’s Ratings Services (“**S&P**”), a rating of “Pfd-3 (high)” by DBRS Limited (“**DBRS**”) and a rating of “BBB-” by Fitch Ratings, Inc. (“**Fitch**”).

Credit ratings are intended to provide investors with an independent measure of credit quality of any issue of securities and are indicators of the likelihood of payment and of the capacity of a company to meet its financial commitment on the rated obligation in accordance with the terms of the rated obligation. The credit ratings assigned to the Series 19 Shares by the rating agencies are not recommendations to buy, sell or hold the Series 19 Shares inasmuch as such ratings do not comment as to market price or suitability for a particular investor, and may be revised or withdrawn entirely at any time by a rating agency. Credit ratings may not reflect the potential impact of all risks on the value of the Series 19 Shares. In addition, real or anticipated changes in the rating assigned to the Series 19 Shares will generally affect the market value of the Series 19 Shares. There can be no assurance that a rating will remain in effect for a given period of time or that a rating will not be revised or withdrawn entirely by a rating agency in the future. The lowering of any rating of the Series 19 Shares may negatively affect the quoted market price, if any, of such Series 19 Shares.

S&P's credit ratings are on a Canadian preferred share rating scale that ranges from P-1 to D, representing the range from highest to lowest quality of such securities rated. The "P-2" rating is the second highest of eight rating categories for preferred shares. An obligation rated "P-2" exhibits adequate protection parameters. However, adverse economic conditions or changing circumstances are more likely to lead to a weakened capacity of the obligor to meet its financial commitment on the obligation. The ratings from P-1 to P-5 may be modified by the addition of a "(high)" or "(low)" modifier within each rating category indicates relative standing within such category. The absence of either a "(high)" or "(low)" designation indicates the rating is in the middle of the category. The "(high)" and "(low)" grades are not used for the CC and D categories.

DBRS' credit ratings are on a preferred share rating scale that ranges from Pfd-1 to D, which represents the range from highest to lowest quality of such securities rated. The "Pfd-3" rating is the third highest of six rating categories for preferred shares. An obligation rated "Pfd-3" are of adequate credit quality. While protection of dividends and principal is still considered acceptable, the issuing entity is more susceptible to adverse changes in financial and economic conditions, and there may be other adverse conditions present which detract from debt protection. The assignment of a "high" or "low" modifier within each rating category indicates relative standing within such category. The absence of either a "high" or "low" designation indicates the rating is in the middle of the category.

Fitch's credit ratings are on a long-term debt rating scale that ranges from AAA to D, which represents the range from highest to lowest quality of such securities rated. The "BBB" rating category is the fourth highest of the eleven major categories used by Fitch. Fitch describes debt instruments rated "BBB" as having good credit quality. An obligation rated "BBB" indicates that expectations of default risk are currently low and that the capacity for payment of financial commitments is considered adequate but adverse business or economic conditions are more likely to impair this capacity. The modifiers "+" or "-" may be appended to a rating to denote relative status within major rating categories.

The Corporation made payments to S&P, DBRS and Fitch in connection with the assignment of ratings to certain of the Corporation's securities and the Corporation will make payments to these rating agencies in connection with the confirmation of such ratings for purposes of any future offerings of such securities. Other than those payments made in respect of credit ratings, no additional payments have been made to any of these rating agencies for any other services provided to the Corporation during the past two years.

PLAN OF DISTRIBUTION

Pursuant to an underwriting agreement (the "**Underwriting Agreement**") dated as of December 4, 2017 among the Corporation and the Underwriters, the Corporation has agreed to sell an aggregate of 20,000,000 Series 19 Shares to the Underwriters, and the Underwriters have severally (and not jointly or jointly and severally) agreed to purchase from the Corporation, as principal, such Series 19 Shares at a price of \$25.00 per Series 19 Share payable in cash against delivery on the Offering Closing Date. The Underwriting Agreement provides that, in consideration of the services of the Underwriters in connection with the Offering, the Corporation will pay the Underwriters a fee of \$0.25 per Series 19 Share issued and sold by the Corporation to certain institutions, and \$0.75 per Series 19 Share for all other Series 19 Shares issued and sold by the Corporation as part of the Offering, for an aggregate fee payable by the Corporation of \$15,000,000, assuming that no Series 19 Shares are sold to such institutions. The Underwriters' fee is payable on the Offering Closing Date and will be paid, along with the expenses of the Offering, which are estimated to be \$300,000, from the general funds of the Corporation.

The terms of the Offering were established through negotiations between the Corporation and the Underwriters.

The obligations of the Underwriters under the Underwriting Agreement are several (and not joint or joint and several) and may be terminated at their discretion upon the occurrence of certain stated events. If an Underwriter fails to purchase the Series 19 Shares which it has agreed to purchase, the other Underwriters may, but are not obligated to, purchase such Series 19 Shares, provided that, if the aggregate number of Series 19 Shares not purchased is less than or equal to 10% of the aggregate number of Series 19 Shares agreed to be purchased by the Underwriters, then each of the other Underwriters is obligated to purchase severally the Series 19 Shares not taken up, on a pro rata basis or as they may otherwise agree as between themselves. If the aggregate number of Series 19 Shares not purchased is greater than 10% of the aggregate number of Series 19 Shares agreed to be purchased by the Underwriters, then each of the other Underwriters shall be relieved of its obligations to purchase its respective percentage of the Series 19 Shares, subject to the terms and conditions of the Underwriting Agreement. The Underwriters are, however, obligated to take up and pay for all Series 19 Shares if any Series 19 Shares are purchased under the Underwriting Agreement. The Underwriting Agreement also provides that the Corporation will indemnify the Underwriters and their respective directors, officers, shareholders, agents and employees against certain liabilities and expenses.

The Underwriters propose to offer the Series 19 Shares initially at the public offering price specified on the cover page of this Prospectus Supplement. After the Underwriters have made a reasonable effort to sell all of the Series 19 Shares offered by this Prospectus Supplement at the price specified herein, the offering price may be decreased and may be further changed from time to time to an amount not greater than \$25.00. In the event the offering price of the Series 19 Shares is reduced, the compensation received by the Underwriters will be decreased by the amount by which the aggregate price paid by the purchasers for the Series 19 Shares is less than the gross proceeds paid by the Underwriters to the Corporation for the Series 19 Shares. Any such reduction will not affect the proceeds received by the Corporation.

Subscriptions for Series 19 Shares will be received subject to rejection or allotment in whole or in part, and the right is reserved to close the subscription books at any time without notice.

The TSX has conditionally approved the listing of the Series 19 Shares and Series 20 Shares. Listing is subject to the Corporation fulfilling all the listing requirements of the TSX. There can be no assurance that the Series 19 Shares and the Series 20 Shares will be accepted for listing on the TSX.

The Corporation has agreed that, subject to certain exceptions, it shall not issue or agree to issue any preference shares or other securities convertible into, or exchangeable for, preference shares prior to 60 days after the Offering Closing Date without the prior consent of Scotia Capital Inc., BMO Nesbitt Burns Inc., CIBC World Markets Inc. and National Bank Financial Inc., on behalf of the Underwriters, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.

Pursuant to policy statements of certain securities regulators, the Underwriters may not, throughout the period of distribution, bid for or purchase Series 19 Shares. The policy statements allow certain exceptions to the foregoing prohibitions. The Underwriters may only avail themselves of such exceptions on the condition that the bid or purchase not be engaged in for the purpose of creating actual or apparent active trading in, or raising the price of, the Series 19 Shares. These exceptions include a bid or purchase permitted under the Universal Market Integrity Rules for Canadian Marketplaces of the Investment Industry Regulatory Organization of Canada, relating to market stabilization and passive market making activities and a bid or purchase made for and on behalf of a customer where the order was not solicited during the period of distribution. Pursuant to the first mentioned exception, in connection with the Offering, the Underwriters may over-allot or effect transactions which stabilize or maintain the market price of the Series 19 Shares at levels other than those which otherwise might prevail on the open market. Such transactions, if commenced, may be discontinued at any time.

Neither the Series 19 Shares nor the Series 20 Shares have been or will be registered under the U.S. Securities Act. They are being sold only outside the United States to non-U.S. Persons (as those terms are defined under Regulation S under the U.S. Securities Act) and may not be reoffered, resold, pledged or otherwise transferred in the United States or to U.S. Persons.

RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE CORPORATION'S LENDERS AND THE UNDERWRITERS

Each of the Underwriters is, directly or indirectly, an affiliate of a bank or other financial institution that is one of the Corporation's lenders and to which the Corporation is currently indebted (collectively, the "Affiliate Lenders"). Consequently, the Corporation may be considered to be a connected issuer of the Underwriters under applicable securities laws.

At December 1, 2017, the Corporation has \$690 million and US\$156 million outstanding indebtedness to the Affiliate Lenders under the Corporation's unsecured credit facilities. In addition, approximately \$1,799 million of the Corporation's credit facilities are being used as a backstop to support outstanding commercial paper balances. The Corporation has complied with the instruments governing its credit facilities and no breach thereof has ever been waived by any of the Affiliate Lenders. Except as otherwise disclosed in this Prospectus Supplement and the Prospectus, the financial position of the Corporation has not changed substantially since the indebtedness under its credit facilities was incurred. The Corporation intends to use the net proceeds from the Offering to partially fund capital projects and to reduce short term indebtedness of the Corporation and its affiliates, which short term indebtedness was used to fund the Corporation's capital program, and for other general corporate purposes and, as a consequence, net proceeds from the Offering may be paid to one or more of the Affiliate Lenders. For more information, see "Use of Proceeds" herein.

The decision to distribute Series 19 Shares pursuant to the Offering was made by the Corporation and the determination of the terms of the Offering was made through negotiations between the Corporation and the Underwriters. The Affiliate Lenders did not have any involvement in such decision or determination but have each been advised of the Offering and the terms thereof. Each of the Underwriters will receive its proportionate share of the aggregate underwriting commission payable by the Corporation to the Underwriters.

CERTAIN CANADIAN FEDERAL INCOME TAX CONSIDERATIONS

In the opinion of McCarthy Tétrault LLP, counsel to the Corporation, and Dentons Canada LLP, counsel to the Underwriters, the following summary, as of the date hereof, describes the principal Canadian federal income tax considerations generally applicable under the provisions of the Tax Act to a prospective purchaser of Series 19 Shares pursuant to this Prospectus Supplement (a “**Holder**”) who, at all relevant times, for the purposes of the Tax Act, is (or is deemed to be) resident in Canada, holds the Series 19 Shares and will hold the Series 20 Shares, as applicable, as capital property, deals at arm’s length with the Corporation and is not affiliated with the Corporation or the Underwriters and is not exempt from tax under Part I of the Tax Act. Generally, the Series 19 Shares or Series 20 Shares will be considered to be capital property to a Holder provided the Holder does not hold the shares in the course of carrying on a business and has not acquired them in one or more transactions considered to be an adventure in the nature of trade. Certain Holders who might not otherwise be considered to hold their Series 19 Shares or Series 20 Shares as capital property may, in certain circumstances, be entitled to have them and every other “Canadian security” (as defined in the Tax Act) owned by them in the taxation year of the election and in all subsequent years treated as capital property by making the irrevocable election permitted by subsection 39(4) of the Tax Act. Holders who will not hold their Series 19 Shares or their Series 20 Shares, as applicable, as capital property should consult their own tax advisers with respect to their own particular circumstances.

This summary is not applicable to a Holder: (i) that is a “financial institution”, as defined in the Tax Act for the purpose of the “mark-to-market property” rules; (ii) an interest in which would be a “tax shelter investment” as defined in the Tax Act; (iii) that is a “specified financial institution” as defined in the Tax Act; (iv) which has made a “functional currency” election under the Tax Act to determine its Canadian tax results in a currency other than Canadian currency; (v) that enters into a “synthetic disposition arrangement” or a “derivative forward agreement”, as such terms are defined in the Tax Act, in respect of the Series 19 Shares or the Series 20 Shares; or (vi) that is a corporation resident in Canada, for the purposes of the Tax Act, or a corporation that does not deal at arm’s length, for the purposes of the Tax Act, with a corporation resident in Canada, and that is or becomes as part of a transaction or event or series of transactions or events that includes the acquisition of the Series 19 Shares controlled by a non-resident corporation, for the purposes of “foreign affiliate dumping” rules in section 212.3 of the Tax Act. Any such Holder should consult its own tax advisors with respect to an investment in the Series 19 Shares.

This summary is based upon the current provisions of the Tax Act, the regulations thereunder (the “**Regulations**”), all specific proposals to amend the Tax Act and the Regulations publicly announced by or on behalf of the Minister of Finance (Canada) prior to the date hereof (the “**Proposals**”), existing case law and counsels’ understanding of the current published administrative and assessing practices of the Canada Revenue Agency. This summary assumes the Proposals will be enacted in the form proposed; however, no assurance can be given that the Proposals will be enacted in their current form, or at all. This summary is not exhaustive of all possible Canadian federal income tax considerations and, except for the Proposals, does not take into account or anticipate any changes in law, whether by legislative, governmental or judicial decision or action, nor does it take into account any provincial, territorial or foreign income tax legislation or considerations.

On July 18, 2017, the Minister of Finance (Canada) released a consultation paper that included an announcement of its intention to amend the Tax Act to increase the tax cost of earning passive investment income through a private corporation. On October 18, 2017, the Minister of Finance (Canada) announced the intention to move forward with these proposals while taking into account the feedback received on the consultation paper. No specific amendments to the Tax Act were proposed in connection with these announcements but are expected to be introduced in the 2018 Federal Budget. Investors that are private Canadian corporations should consult their own tax advisors.

This summary is of a general nature only and is not intended to be, nor should it be construed to be, legal or tax advice to any particular Holder of Series 19 Shares or Series 20 Shares. No representations are made with respect to the income tax consequences to any particular Holder. Consequently, prospective Holders should consult their own tax advisers with respect to their particular circumstances for advice with respect to the tax consequences to them of acquiring, holding and disposing of the Series 19 Shares or the Series 20 Shares, including the application and effect of the income and other tax laws of any country, province, state or local tax authority.

Dividends

Dividends (including deemed dividends) received (or deemed to be received) on the Series 19 Shares or the Series 20 Shares, as the case may be, by an individual (other than certain trusts) will be included in the individual’s income and will be subject to the gross-up and dividend tax credit rules normally applicable to taxable dividends received from taxable Canadian corporations. Individuals are entitled to an enhanced gross-up and dividend tax credit in respect of “eligible dividends” received from taxable Canadian corporations, such as the Corporation, if such dividends have been designated as eligible dividends by the Corporation at or before the time of payment. By notice in writing on the Corporation’s website, the

Corporation has designated all dividends paid by the Corporation to be “eligible dividends” within the meaning of the Tax Act unless otherwise notified.

Dividends received by a Holder who is an individual (other than certain trusts) may give rise to a liability for alternative minimum tax.

Dividends (including deemed dividends) received on the Series 19 Shares or the Series 20 Shares, as the case may be, by a Holder which is a corporation will be included in computing the Holder’s income and will generally be deductible in computing the Holder’s taxable income. In certain circumstances, subsection 55(2) of the Tax Act will treat a taxable dividend received by a Holder that is a corporation as proceeds of disposition or a capital gain. A “private corporation”, as defined in the Tax Act, or any other corporation controlled (whether by reason of a beneficial interest in one or more trusts or otherwise) by or for the benefit of an individual (other than a trust) or a related group of individuals (other than trusts), will generally be liable to pay a refundable tax under Part IV of the Tax Act on dividends received (or deemed to be received) on the Series 19 Shares or the Series 20 Shares, as the case may be, to the extent such dividends are deductible in computing its taxable income.

The Series 19 Shares and the Series 20 Shares will be “taxable preferred shares” as defined in the Tax Act. The terms of the Series 19 Shares and the Series 20 Shares require the Corporation to make the necessary election under Part VI.1 of the Tax Act so that corporate Holders will not be subject to tax under Part IV.1 of the Tax Act on dividends received (or deemed to be received) on the Series 19 Shares or the Series 20 Shares.

Dispositions

A Holder who disposes of or is deemed to dispose of Series 19 Shares or Series 20 Shares (on the redemption of such shares or otherwise, but not including on a conversion of Series 19 Shares into Series 20 Shares or a conversion of Series 20 Shares into Series 19 Shares) will generally realize a capital gain (or a capital loss) to the extent that the Holder’s proceeds of disposition, net of any reasonable costs of disposition, exceed (or are less than) the adjusted cost base of such shares to the Holder. The amount of any deemed dividend arising on the redemption, acquisition or cancellation by the Corporation of Series 19 Shares or Series 20 Shares, as the case may be, will generally not be included in computing the Holder’s proceeds of disposition for purposes of computing the capital gain (or capital loss) arising on the disposition of such Series 19 Shares or Series 20 Shares, as the case may be. See “Redemption” below. If the Holder is a corporation, any capital loss arising on a disposition of a Series 19 Share or a Series 20 Share, as the case may be, may, in certain circumstances, be reduced by the amount of any dividends, including deemed dividends, which have been received (or deemed to be received) on the Series 19 Shares or Series 20 Shares or any share which was converted into such share. Analogous rules apply to a partnership or trust of which a corporation, partnership or trust is a member or beneficiary.

Generally, one-half of any capital gain will be included in computing the Holder’s income in the year of disposition as a taxable capital gain and one-half of any capital loss (an “allowable capital loss”) must be deducted from the Holder’s taxable capital gains in the year of disposition. Allowable capital losses in excess of taxable capital gains for a taxation year generally may be carried back up to three taxation years or carried forward indefinitely and deducted against net taxable capital gains in those other taxation years. Capital gains realized by an individual may give rise to a liability for alternative minimum tax. Taxable capital gains of a “Canadian-controlled private corporation”, as defined in the Tax Act, may be subject to an additional refundable tax.

Redemption

If the Corporation redeems Series 19 Shares or Series 20 Shares, or otherwise acquires or cancels Series 19 Shares or Series 20 Shares (other than by a purchase by the Corporation of the shares in the open market in the manner in which shares are normally purchased by any member of the public in the open market), the Holder will be deemed to have received a dividend equal to the amount, if any, paid by the Corporation (including any redemption premium) in excess of the paid-up capital (as determined for purposes of the Tax Act) of such shares at such time. Generally, any excess of the amount paid over the amount of the deemed dividend will be treated as proceeds of disposition for purposes of computing the capital gain or capital loss arising on the disposition of such shares. See “Dispositions” above. In the case of a corporate holder, it is possible that in certain circumstances all or part of any such deemed dividend may be treated as proceeds of disposition and not as a dividend.

Conversion

The conversion of Series 19 Shares into Series 20 Shares and the conversion of Series 20 Shares into Series 19 Shares will not constitute a disposition of property for purposes of the Tax Act and, accordingly, will not give rise to a capital gain or capital loss. The cost to a Holder of the Series 19 Shares or Series 20 Shares, as the case may be, received on the

conversion will, subject to the cost averaging rules contained in the Tax Act for identical properties, be deemed to be equal to the Holder's adjusted cost base of the converted Series 19 Shares or Series 20 Shares, as the case may be, immediately before the conversion.

ELIGIBILITY FOR INVESTMENT

In the opinion of McCarthy Tétrault LLP, counsel to the Corporation, and Dentons Canada LLP, counsel to the Underwriters, the Series 19 Shares offered hereby and the Series 20 Shares, if issued on the date hereof, generally would be qualified investments under the Tax Act and the Regulations for a trust governed by a registered retirement savings plan ("RRSP"), a registered retirement income fund ("RRIF"), a registered education savings plan ("RESP"), a registered disability savings plan ("RDSP"), a deferred profit sharing plan, or a tax-free savings account ("TFSA"). Notwithstanding that the Series 19 Shares and Series 20 Shares may be qualified investments for a trust governed by a TFSA, RRSP or RRIF, the holder of a TFSA or the annuitant under an RRSP or RRIF may be subject to a penalty tax if such Series 19 Shares or Series 20 Shares are "prohibited investments" for the TFSA, RRSP or RRIF within the meaning of the Tax Act. The Series 19 Shares and Series 20 Shares will generally not be a "prohibited investment" provided that the holder of the TFSA or the annuitant under the RRSP or RRIF, as the case may be, deals at arm's length with the Corporation and does not have a "significant interest" in the Corporation, all as defined in and for purposes of the Tax Act. In addition, the Series 19 Shares or Series 20 Shares will generally not be a "prohibited investment" if such shares are "excluded property" (as defined in the Tax Act) for trusts governed by a TFSA, RRSP or RRIF. Pursuant to legislative proposals to amend the Tax Act released on October 25, 2017, the rules in respect of "prohibited investments" are proposed to also apply to (i) RDSPs and the holders thereof and (ii) RESPs and the subscribers thereof, effective after March 22, 2017.

Prospective investors who intend to hold Series 19 Shares or Series 20 Shares in their TFSA, RRSP, RRIF, RDSP or RESP should consult their own tax advisors regarding their particular circumstances.

RISK FACTORS

An investment in the Series 19 Shares offered hereunder involves certain risks. In addition to the other information contained in this Prospectus Supplement and the accompanying Prospectus, and in the documents incorporated by reference therein, prospective purchasers of Series 19 Shares should consider carefully the risk factors set forth below, as well as the risk factors referenced in the accompanying Prospectus under the heading "Risk Factors".

Market for Securities

There is currently no market through which the Series 19 Shares may be sold and purchasers of Series 19 Shares may not be able to resell the Series 19 Shares purchased under this Prospectus Supplement. The price offered to the public for the Series 19 Shares and the number of Series 19 Shares to be issued have been determined by negotiations among the Corporation and the Underwriters. The price paid for each Series 19 Share may bear no relationship to the price at which the Series 19 Shares will trade in the public market subsequent to this Offering. The Corporation cannot predict at what price the Series 19 Shares will trade and there can be no assurance that an active trading market will develop for the Series 19 Shares or, if developed, that such market will be sustained. The TSX has conditionally approved the listing of the Series 19 Shares and Series 20 Shares. Listing is subject to the Corporation fulfilling all the listing requirements of the TSX. There can be no assurance that the Series 19 Shares and Series 20 Shares will be accepted for listing on the TSX.

Market Price

The market price of the Series 19 Shares and Series 20 Shares may fluctuate due to a variety of factors relative to the Corporation's business, including announcements of new developments, fluctuations in the Corporation's operating results, sales of the Series 19 Shares and Series 20 Shares in the marketplace, failure to meet analysts' expectations, any public announcements made in regard to this Offering, the impact of various tax laws or rates and general market conditions or the worldwide economy. In recent years, stock markets have experienced significant price fluctuations, which have been unrelated to the operating performance of the affected companies. There can be no assurance that the market price of the Series 19 Shares and Series 20 Shares will not experience significant fluctuations in the future, including fluctuations that are unrelated to the Corporation's performance.

Prevailing yields on similar securities will affect the market value of the Series 19 Shares and Series 20 Shares. Assuming all other factors remain unchanged, the market value of the Series 19 Shares and Series 20 Shares would be expected to decline as prevailing yields for similar securities rise and would be expected to increase as prevailing yields for similar securities decline. Spreads over the Government of Canada Yield, T-Bill Rate and comparable benchmark rates of interest for similar securities will also affect the market value of the Series 19 Shares and the Series 20 Shares in an analogous manner.

Dividends

Provisions of various trust indentures and credit arrangements to which the Corporation is a party restrict the Corporation's ability to declare and pay dividends under certain circumstances and, if such restrictions apply, they may, in turn, have an impact on the Corporation's ability to declare and pay dividends on the Series 19 Shares and Series 20 Shares. The dividend rate in respect of the Series 19 Shares will reset on March 1, 2023 and every five years thereafter. The dividend rate in respect of the Series 20 Shares will reset quarterly. In each case, the new dividend rate is unlikely to be the same as, and may be lower than, the dividend rate for the applicable preceding dividend period.

Investments in the Series 20 Shares, given their floating interest component, entail risks not associated with investments in the Series 19 Shares. The resetting of the applicable rate on a Series 20 Share may result in a lower yield compared to fixed rate Series 19 Shares. The applicable rate on a Series 20 Share will fluctuate in accordance with fluctuations in the T-Bill Rate on which the applicable rate is based, which in turn may fluctuate and be affected by a number of interrelated factors, including economic, financial and political events over which the Corporation has no control. See "Details of the Offering - Dividends on Series 20 Shares".

Credit Ratings

The credit ratings applied to the Series 19 Shares are an assessment, by the Rating Agencies, of the Corporation's ability to pay its obligations. The credit ratings are based on certain assumptions about the future performance and capital structure of the Corporation that may or may not reflect the actual performance or capital structure of the Corporation. Changes in credit ratings of the Series 19 Shares may affect the market price or value and the liquidity of the Series 19 Shares. There is no assurance that any credit rating assigned to the Series 19 Shares will remain in effect for any given period of time or that any rating will not be lowered or withdrawn entirely by the relevant rating agency. See "Credit Ratings".

Insolvency or Winding-Up

The Series 19 Shares and Series 20 Shares are equity capital of the Corporation which rank equally with other preference shares, if any, in the event of an insolvency or winding-up of the Corporation. If the Corporation becomes insolvent or is wound up, the Corporation's assets must be used to pay liabilities and other debt before payments may be made on the Series 19 Shares, Series 20 Shares and other preference shares, if any.

Automatic Conversion

An investment in the Series 19 Shares, or in the Series 20 Shares, as the case may be, may become an investment in Series 20 Shares, or in Series 19 Shares, without the consent of the holder in the event of an automatic conversion in the circumstances described under "Details of the Offering - Conversion of Series 19 Shares into Series 20 Shares" and "Details of the Offering - Conversion of Series 20 Shares into Series 19 Shares". Upon automatic conversion of the Series 19 Shares into Series 20 Shares, the dividend rate on the Series 20 Shares will be a floating rate that is adjusted quarterly by reference to the T-Bill Rate which may vary from time to time while, upon the automatic conversion of the Series 20 Shares into Series 19 Shares, the dividend rate on the Series 19 Shares will be, for each five-year period, a fixed rate that is determined by reference to the Government of Canada Yield on the 30th day prior to the first day of each such five-year period. In addition, holders may be prevented from converting their Series 19 Shares into Series 20 Shares in certain circumstances. See "Details of the Offering - Conversion of Series 19 Shares into Series 20 Shares" and "Details of the Offering - Conversion of Series 20 Shares into Series 19 Shares".

No Fixed Maturity

Neither the Series 19 Shares nor the Series 20 Shares have a fixed maturity date and are not redeemable at the option of the holders of Series 19 Shares or the Series 20 Shares, as applicable. The ability of a holder to liquidate its holdings of Series 19 Shares and the Series 20 Shares, as applicable, may be limited.

Redeemable

The Corporation may choose to redeem the Series 19 Shares and/or the Series 20 Shares from time to time, in accordance with its rights described under "Details of the Offering - Redemption of Series 19 Shares" and "Details of the Offering - Redemption of the Series 20 Shares", including when prevailing interest rates are lower than yield borne by the Series 19 Shares and the Series 20 Shares. If prevailing rates are lower at the time of redemption, a purchaser would not be able to reinvest the redemption proceeds in a comparable security at an effective yield as high as the yield on the Series 19 Shares or the Series 20 Shares being redeemed. The Corporation's redemption right also may adversely impact a purchaser's ability to sell Series 19 Shares and Series 20 Shares.

LEGAL MATTERS

Certain legal matters relating to Canadian law in connection with the Series 19 Shares offered hereby will be passed upon on behalf of the Corporation by McCarthy Tétrault LLP, and on behalf of the Underwriters by Dentons Canada LLP.

INTERESTS OF EXPERTS

As at the date of this Prospectus Supplement, the partners and associates of McCarthy Tétrault LLP, as a group, and the partners and associates of Dentons Canada LLP, as a group, beneficially own, directly or indirectly, less than 1% of any class of securities of the Corporation. In connection with the audit of the Corporation's consolidated annual financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2016, PricewaterhouseCoopers LLP confirmed that they are independent within the meaning of the Rules of Professional Conduct of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Alberta.

The consolidated financial statements of Spectra Energy and its subsidiaries as at and for the years ended December 31, 2016 and 2015, appearing in the BAR incorporated by reference in this Prospectus Supplement, have been so incorporated in reliance on the audit report of Deloitte & Touche LLP, which is also incorporated by reference in this Prospectus Supplement. In connection with the audit of the consolidated statements of operations of Spectra Energy as at and for the year ended December 31, 2016, which are incorporated by reference in this Prospectus Supplement, Deloitte & Touche LLP confirmed that they are independent within the meaning of the U.S. Securities Act and the applicable rules and regulations thereunder adopted by the SEC and the Public Company Accounting Oversight Board (United States) as of the date of issuance of the Spectra Energy Form 10-K.

AUDITORS, TRANSFER AGENT AND REGISTRAR

The Corporation's auditors are PricewaterhouseCoopers LLP, Calgary, Alberta.

The transfer agent and registrar for the Series 19 Shares and Series 20 Shares is AST Trust Company at its principal offices in Calgary, Alberta, and Toronto, Ontario.

STATUTORY RIGHTS OF WITHDRAWAL AND RESCISSION

Securities legislation in certain of the provinces of Canada provides purchasers with the right to withdraw from an agreement to purchase securities. This right may be exercised within two business days after receipt or deemed receipt of a prospectus and any amendment. In several of the provinces, the securities legislation further provides a purchaser with remedies for rescission or, in some jurisdictions, revisions of the price or damages if the prospectus and any amendment contains a misrepresentation or is not delivered to the purchaser, provided that the remedies for rescission, revisions of the price or damages are exercised by the purchaser within the time limit prescribed by the securities legislation of the purchaser's province. The purchaser should refer to any applicable provisions of the securities legislation of the purchaser's province for the particulars of these rights or consult with a legal advisor.
