This week in spread 4 has been a busy one. Each crew has been working at an exceptional pace considering the mild weather. The final clean up crew is cruising along each day. At the beginning of this week the crews have been slowly getting prepared for the Native prairie zone at the High Pound Hill area. Equipment have been going through the fine clean station before even stepping foot in the zone, this measure prevents any spreading of seeds in the highly sensitive area. The trimmers have come back into the spread and have been trimming in areas that have been missed or areas that the weed spraying didn't completely work. It has also been there final week here as they will be straw crimping in the week to come. Mechanical clean up crew have been decompacting. (Breaking of large clumps on ROW) and also have been moving the topsoil piles for the dozers the completely move over topsoil for finished product.

In the middle of this week the Aboriginal Monitors met up with the Pasqua representatives. The crews have now reached the High Pound Hill area and have done an excellent job in completion of putting soils back together. Awesome to hear that the reps were happy about this area being done correctly.

Lastly this week has been well productive. The Following week we can expect some more production done. This coming week is to have mild temperatures in which will help the production and process of work.
