In the beginning of the week the Aboriginal monitors was spread out throughout the area covering different areas in which crews are still working. The different crews are working at very fast pace which resulted in progress of the project. The final clean up crew is doing so well, each day they show an excellent amount of progression. The work they put in is looking good. The NCRS Straw crimping crew is also making progress as the days go by. When the weather is cooperative they can straw crimp a large area throughout the day. At the Qu'Appelle valley, the work there is slowly wrapping up with a clean up crew working on the slope. It is anticipated the work will be completed in the following work week.

The bridge at High Hill Creek area was taken out middle of this week. The crew remains in the area correcting the slope and creating diversion berms. Lastly towards the end of this week they began working at the Iskwao Creek moving rocks and slowly bringing equipment to the area. The equipment will be mechanically cleaned before they start to work in the area. This week has been good, however, in the end of this week the weather began to be mild and rain was much in the forecast.


