Additional Observations and Summary of Activities or Concerns

Pre-construction activities are in full force at Spread 4. A lot of topsoil stripping and fencing has been taking place since the preconstruction process started. The Spread 4 team has been observing a lot of the areas close up and plan on continuing the trend as the project moves forward

On September 16th and 17th, The Spread 4 team was permitted to participate in an archeological dig to look for artifacts in the Qu'Appelle valley. Two artifacts were discovered during the archeological dig. These artifacts included a old arrowhead which was used for hunting and a tool which was used for scraping fur and hide from buffalo or elk.

There has not been to many much wildlife sightings in spread 4. The most common sightings are of coyotes, deer and snow geese. The birds who have nested on or around the right of way during the summer months have all left there nests as part of their natural migratory pattern.
