Additional Observations and Summary of Activities or Concerns

Work on spread 6 continued with repairing the access plug crossings at several locations throughout the spread, access plugs are crossings which farmers use to cross right of way. We also worked at Cromer Station repairing wingwalls, putting up snow fence and picking up debris such as filter bags used at dewatering sites and wood chips. Creek clean up began mid-week, cleaning out sediment that flowed through the silt fence into the creek bed, using a skid steer bucket to clean out some but due to muddy conditions were not able to complete – follow up required.

The end of the week the work crew moved access mats over to the creek SK WC84, to continue to clean up the sediment that flowed into the creek area in preparation for Monday.
