Additional Observations and Summary of Activities or Concerns

Line 3 is a 1097-mile pipeline that was installed in the 1960s. extending from Edmonton Alberta to Superior Wisconsin. The line was put into service in 1968.

Enbridge Line 3 Replacement Pipeline consist of 1,031 miles of 36-inch diameter pipeline that began in Alberta with Spread one and is now in process of spread five and six. With Kick, off scheduled for Aug 1st 2018.

Spread six spans 122.7 kilometers

This first week was combined training, acquiring information for site procedures, safety and familiarizing monitors with site route locations. July 16th-18th .ACM from both five and six spread received SGS orientation and training. Project safety orientation facilitated by Banister was conducted on July19th. Bio security training was received by (Summit) environmental, everyone requires this training on site. Stations for cleaning are set up throughout the sites and between every municipal boundary to prevent cross contamination.ACM attended daily safety and construction meetings.


